The COVID global pandemic forced families to make complex decisions, especially where their health was concerned. For families living paycheck to paycheck, job loss or illness can devastate their finances. Low-income families are particularly vulnerable.

When Sue's mother was diagnosed with cancer and needed in-home care, she had to make the difficult decision to leave her job. Around the same time, Sue's son and three grandchildren had to move into her home due to COVID concerns where they were living, straining the household's finances even further.

Although money would be tight, Sue and her husband were determined to make it work.

Unfortunately, Sue's mother lost her battle with cancer and, shortly after, her husband lost his job. Now the family knew they needed assistance to make it through these trying times.

Sue's family turned to Couleecap's Monroe County food pantry for food assistance. They had access to a selection of fresh vegetables, fruits, frozen meat, and canned goods for their extended family. Sue learned that she could visit the pantry whenever she needed to.
