

WHAT WE HEARD FROM CRAWFORD COUNTY LOW-INCOME RESIDENTS



HAVE INCOME FROM SOCIAL SECURITY OR SOCIAL SECURITY DISABILITY, BUT RELY ON FOOD PANTRIES, FOODSHARE, AND OTHER FORMS OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE TO GET BY.



58% SAID FOOD WAS A HIGH NEED.



90% HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE, YET OUT OF POCKET MEDICAL COSTS AND FINDING DENTAL CARE AND HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS, EVEN FOR THOSE WITH INSURANCE, ARE BARRIERS TO



75% STRUGGLE TO PAY FOR UTILITY BILLS AND/OR HOME REPAIRS.



55% SAID COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH OWNING A VEHICLE WAS A HIGH NEED.



60% of working respondents needed higher wage jobs with benefits.



CRAWFORD COUNTY

Couleecap, Inc. surveyed 64 low-income households to learn more about their everyday needs. Though the poverty level for a family of four is \$25,750 in Crawford County a family of four needs to earn \$59,160 for basic survival. Our data shows the greatest needs and challenges that low-income people in Crawford County are struggling with are transportation, employment, and health.
